APPROVAL OF APPROPRIATION OF EXTRAORDINARY AID FOR 2012-2013

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey, Department of Education notified the district of the award of Extraordinary Aid for the 2011-12 school year in the amount of \$434,097; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education did not include an estimated Extraordinary Aide payment in its 2011-12 school budget; and

WHEREAS, N.J.A.C.6A:23A-2.13(d)6 provides that a district Board of Education may, at any time, and without Commissioner approval, appropriate surplus generated from state revenue, such as Extraordinary Aid, that has been excluded from the excess surplus calculation in the prior year as noted in the audit;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Pequannock Township Board of Education approves appropriating the 2011-12 fiscal year Extraordinary Aid funding to the 2012-13 school budget for the purpose of improvements for instructional purposes, for expanded programs, and for facility improvements in accordance with the updated Facility Audit as follows:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education approves the transfer of funds in the amount of \$718,460 from the Capital Reserve Fund to capital outlay project accounts (12-000-400-450-98-720 = \$668,000 and 12-000-400-390-98-000 = \$50,460) for the Phase III Field Renovation projects at Stephen J. Gerace School and Pequannock Township Middle School, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that funds refunded to the district by the Township of Pequannock for their portion of the construction of the ninety (90) foot baseball field, be returned to the Capital Reserve Fund at the conclusion of the fiscal year in which they are received.
