committee to review it.

The discussion continued. A straw poll was taken regarding if the Board supported a district policy more substantive than the de facto NJSIAA policy and the vote was unanimous in favor of having a district policy developed. The Board President thanked the Administration for its input.

• A discussion of how a club is formed was revisited. Mr. Salerno wanted to see this topic as an item on the Policy Committee agenda. Mr. Swezey pointed out that policy 2430 states that a new club needs approval by the Superintendent.

NEW BUSINESS

- The Board President discussed the possibility of our district passing a resolution regarding unfunded State mandates, using the Montville school district's resolution as a model. A straw poll taken resulted in a unanimous vote in favor of putting an unfunded mandate resolution on a future agenda for action. Some Board members cautioned that we should be mindful of the timing of the passing of this resolution so that our State aid is not compromised. The Board Attorney mentioned that the Wayne Board of Education is looking for additional districts to form a partnership to file a joint complaint to the State.
- Mr. Swezey suggested referring to policies 2430, 5741, and 5512 with regard to the formation of a GSA club.
